### SEPTEMBER WIM NETWORK LUNCH: WALK UPDATE

The Little Team that Did It!

The lunch held on September 13<sup>th</sup> was our biggest ever and the atmosphere was electric. The energy brought by the team of 9 who represented the WIM network during the 60km Weekend to End Breast Cancer walk on Sept. 8-9<sup>th</sup>. Each of the team members reported back on their experience of the walk - the emotional highs and lows and the multiple blisters as well! The team announced that it had raised an astonishing \$192,000+, including an incredible \$25,000 that was raised the day prior to the walk thanks to a massive email campaign that helped get the team to the finish! The team was first place overall with over 390 donations and 55+ companies represented, benefiting the Princess Margaret Hospital.

Christine Laskey from the hospital foundation called in on a special conference link to thank us for our wonderful work and talk about the use of proceeds from the walk and how it has helped in the treatment and research for women with breast cancer around the globe. A staggering \$17,300,000 this year, and over \$60,000,000 in the five years of the walk. The PMH is one of the top 5 Breast Cancer treatment centers in the world.

The meeting was well attended with 54 women, along with women who called in for the special conference, including Ann Carpenter and Arloa Woolford from Reno, Nevada; Barbara Caelles from Vancouver, B.C.; and our newest member, Maryse Belanger of Kinross Gold, all the way from Brazil! Maryse is so inspired by our work that she is establishing a WIM network group in both Brazil and Chile.

After the lunch, the team crashed the board meeting of the Canadian Mining Hall of Fame and raised a further \$8,000 bringing our total to \$200,000.

We are so inspired by the power of our WIM network and how it all came together for the walk. We look forward to continuing our good work on many, many levels in the future.

- ▶ A team of walkers raised over \$200,000 for breast cancer research, mainly from Canadian mining companies, under the banner of WIM.

**NEWSLETTER CHANGES**


